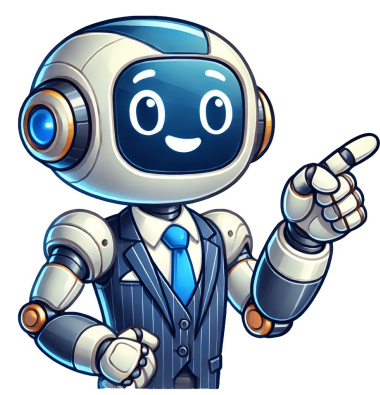

When printing a certificate we suggest you first download the file to your PC and then print from there. There is a print icon that will allow you to print directly but the certificate does not always fit on one page. This can be avoided by downloading the image first. For a newborns certificate, please wait at least two weeks after the birth of the child before placing an order. Rules & Regulations: a Death Certificate You can order a death certificate in person, by mail, or online. A death certificate is available for 75 years after the death. Before ordering a certificate for a recent death, please speak with the funeral home handling the arrangements to make sure that they have filed the death record. Bear in mind that county offices generally provide faster processing times and more payment flexibility, since you may be able to obtain your records within one week, and may be provided the option to pay issuance fees by credit card, either by phone, fax or online. An additional fee is charged by VitalChek for this service, and all major credit cards are accepted, including American Express, Discover, MasterCard or Visa. This Vital Records office may be reached through the telephone number or email address given below. It is also possible to order your vital records online through the official website of the County Vital Records office. To obtain a copy of a divorce decree, you will need to contact the Clerk of the Superior Court in the county where the divorce was granted. Death records are sometimes available only from a certain year onwards; this can be verified with the county recorder. Please note that official information is provided by government sites only, so contact information provided below may not be up to date.
